The City of Milwaukee Health Department (MHD) continues to lead coordination efforts with the City of Milwaukee and Milwaukee County, monitoring the impacts of the ongoing federal government shutdown on local food and health programs, including FoodShare, WIC, and Affordable Care Act (ACA) coverage, while also connecting affected families with community support.

in partial benefits being issued, but no timeline has been announced. FoodShare members can continue to use any funds currently available on their QUEST cards, which will not be removed during the shutdown.

City-County Food Drive Progress

In response to the FoodShare delay, the City of Milwaukee and Milwaukee County launched a joint food drive last week in partnership with Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin and NourishMKE, alongside key community partners including the Milwaukee Bucks, Milwaukee

Public Schools, and multiple faith-based organizations.

Thanks to generous community donations, the drive has now raised more than \$74,000, enough to fund over

222,000 meals for Eastern Wisconsin families across the region. This total includes a generous contribution from the Brewers Community Foundation, which donated \$10,000 each

to Feeding America and Hunger Task Force in support of the emergency food drive. The organization is encouraging Brewers fans to join in giving Wisconsin FoodShare Continued to page 14

Claudia Sheinbaum y el presidente de Miss Universo defienden a Fátima Bosch: “Ya basta, Nawat”

El abuso verbal de Nawat Itsaragrisil sobre Fátima Bosch ha llegado hasta la conferencia mañanera de la presidenta de México, quien reconoció a la tabasqueña porque ejemplifica cómo las mujeres deben levantar la voz. “Antes nos decían: ‘calladita te ves más bonita’. ¿Cómo que calladita te ves más bonita? Las mujeres nos vemos más bonitas cuando alzamos la voz y participamos, porque eso tiene que ver con el reconocimiento de nuestros derechos”, dijo la mandataria esta mañana. Horas antes, durante la noche de este martes, Raúl Rocha, presidente de Miss Universo, publicó un video en el que reprueba los hechos que vivió Bosch y asegura que Itsaragrisil enfrentará acciones corporativas y legales por los insultos y la humillación que le propició a la mexicana. “Ya basta, Nawat”, dice Rocha molesto. Añade que el tailandés siempre quiere que los reflectores se posen sobre él y lamenta haber confiado que esta vez sería diferente.

Las disculpas públicas que dio Itsaragrisil, presidente de Miss Grand Internacional y vicepresidente de la región oriental de Miss Universo, no fueron suficientes para que continuara con las

labores de organización para el evento que se celebra este 21 de noviembre en Bangkok. De acuerdo con Rocha, la ceremonia de colocación de bandas se pospuso para evitar que las 122 concursantes del certamen interactuaran con Itsaragrisil. “No permitiré que ninguna de ellas sea atacada ni humillada. He condicionado la participación de Nawat en los eventos que forman parte del certamen 74 de Miss Universo y que esta sea muy limitada o nula. He instruido a nuestro CEO, Mario Búcaro, para que emita un comunicado en nombre de la organización, donde detalle todas las acciones corporativas y legales que llevaremos a cabo”, zanja Rocha. En Bangkok, durante la tarde de este miércoles 5 de noviembre, Itsaragrisil ha vuelto a pedir perdón, esta vez envuelto en llanto frente a los medios locales, vestido con un esmoquin negro, camisa blanca y moño azul marino. Más tarde, durante un evento televisado, Itsaragrisil fungió como maestro de ceremonias y ofreció disculpas una vez más. “Soy humano, la presión es demasiada”, justificó el tailandés. “No te di permiso de hablar” Durante la madrugada del martes 4



de noviembre se viralizó un video en el que Nawat Itsaragrisil habla frente a las concursantes en el salón de un hotel en la capital de Tailandia; él se encuentra de pie, el resto sentadas. Itsaragrisil preguntó dónde está México y Bosch se levantó de su asiento, más de ocho filas hacia el fondo. El presidente la increpó: “¿Es cierto que te has negado a subir contenido de Tailandia a tus redes sociales porque tu representante te lo ha negado?”. Bosch no entendió la pregunta y dijo que quizás se trataba de un malentendido. El tailandés llamó tonta a la mexicana y la mandó callar: “No te di permiso de hablar”. Pero Bosch insistió en defenderse del abuso verbal al que estaba siendo sometida frente a sus compañeras. Itsaragrisil mandó llamar al personal de seguridad y sacaron

a la mexicana de la ceremonia. Horas más tarde, Itsaragrisil realizó una transmisión en vivo a través de su cuenta personal de TikTok en la que ofreció

disculpas a quienes se hayan sentido afectados. Después, justificó que el altercado fue provocado por Bosch, ya que no debió

levantarse ni seguir hablando. También dijo estar molesto porque, además de México, otros países se habían negado a publicar contenido sobre Tailandia. s

Renuncia el primer juez federal elegido por voto popular

México eligió a sus jueces por primera vez este junio mediante voto popular en unas controvertidas elecciones que siguen originando episodios sin precedentes casi medio año después. Este martes ha renunciado el primer juzgador federal de los 881 cargos que salieron de las urnas meses atrás. Se trata de Adrián Guadalupe Aguirre, juzgador en materia penal en Jalisco, que ha presentado su dimisión apenas dos meses después de haber tomado protesta del cargo. La petición de renuncia ha llegado a la Mesa Directiva del Senado, que ya la ha trasladado a la Comisión de Justicia para su resolución. El órgano deberá dictaminar si las causas de la renuncia son o no razonables. En caso de resolver contra la petición de dimisión, si el juez persiste en su intención, el abandono puede ser motivo de responsabilidad civil o administrativa, según explican fuentes de la Comisión.

Adrián Guadalupe Aguirre se desempeñaba desde el 1 de septiembre como juez de distrito en el Centro de Justicia Penal de Puente Grande, la zona en la que se ubica la cárcel de alta seguridad de la que escapó el famoso narcotraficante y antiguo líder del Cartel de Sinaloa Joaquín El Chapo Guzmán, clausurada parcialmente en 2020. El juez electo había sido propuesto por el Poder Ejecutivo federal y ganó los comicios con 36.084 votos, 6.000 votos más que la segunda en la carrera, Amalia Irandery Ortiz, quien pasaría a ocupar ahora el cargo, según está previsto en la reforma judicial. Ella

fue propuesta por el Poder Legislativo. Se desconocen las razones de la renuncia y Aguirre no ha hecho ninguna declaración al respecto. Ha borrado, además, cualquier rastro en sus redes sociales oficiales. En su ficha de candidato, el abogado argumentó que competía por un cargo porque quería “ser parte de los primeros jueces en la historia de México que imparten justicia al pueblo y NO a los privilegiados”.

Entre sus propuestas, que incluían agilizar las resoluciones y fomentar la transparencia y la rendición de cuentas de los juzgadores, planteaba contar con “puertas abiertas para el pueblo en general” en su oficina “para que no haya incertidumbre respecto a sus asuntos”. Este es el primer juez federal en intentar abandonar el cargo de forma definitiva, el segundo si se tiene en cuenta una solicitud de licencia anterior que fue rechazada por el Senado. En ese caso se trató

de Gabriela Pacheco Torres, directora general de Evaluación en Aduanas, que contendió por el puesto de jueza penal de distrito en Ciudad de México, igualmente a propuesta del Poder Ejecutivo. La candidata se hizo con el puesto por 37.414 votos, el doble que la siguiente candidata en la lista, y su solicitud de licencia llegó el día después de haber tomado posesión del cargo, según se lee en el documento. En su escrito alegó que necesitaba tiempo para resolver sus

asuntos pendientes, después. La comisión que exigían “un cierre ordenado, transparente y responsable de los procesos en curso” y causa justificada para pidió apartarse del cargo concedérsela y la rechazó. hasta el 2 de marzo de 2026, medio año

investigación, algunos por más de cinco años

“Este esfuerzo no es solo un acto de memoria: es un grito colectivo que denuncia la indiferencia del Estado, la impunidad que persiste en los tribunales y la falta de políticas públicas que protejan la vida de las mujeres, niñas y personas trans en Puerto Rico”, señaló Figueroa.

La campaña mediática inició en el Colegio de Abogadas y Abogados de Puerto Rico con un encuentro de organizaciones aliadas del movimiento por la equidad de género. Allí, portavoces de estas entidades se alternaron para mostrar los rostros y leer los nombres de las 455 víctimas de feminicidios que documentó el Observatorio en seis años.

Asimismo, se levantaron reclamos como apoyar la Ley 40 en los casos de feminicidios; asignar recursos económicos sostenidos



a los albergues, del Observatorio, recordando que este mes se conmemora Mes de No Más Violencia contra la Mujer.

Ante los feminicidios, las organizaciones, familias y comunidades exigieron otros puntos esenciales para atender con efectividad el problema como: una vida libre de violencia para todas las mujeres, niñas y personas trans; políticas públicas de reparación para las hijas e hijos que han perdido a sus madres por violencia, así como a sus familiares y custodias que cargan con el duelo y la responsabilidad; reconocimiento de todos los feminicidios, sin jerarquías ni estigmas; y procesos de investigación ágiles y efectivos para las mujeres y menores desaparecidas.

En cuanto al gobierno, Figueroa planteó que es necesario que se asuma “responsabilidad del Estado en los feminicidios donde la negligencia institucional ha costado vidas, como el caso de Claribel, quien esperó más de una hora por una ambulancia tras el ataque de su agresor, Andrea Costas que le negaron una orden de protección en más de una ocasión e Ivette Joan Meléndez Vega que fue asesinada a manos de Hermes Dávila, quien fue excarcelado bajo la Ley 25 por supuesta condición médica severa. Dicha salida se autorizó con diagnósticos no corroborados y sin evaluaciones”.

Además, las portavoces del Observatorio apuntaron que el gobierno tiene la obligación de defender con firmeza las leyes que protegen a las mujeres, que no deben minimizar la dimensión estructural de la violencia machista y que reclaman que el Estado identifique y nombre los asesinatos de mujeres como feminicidios.

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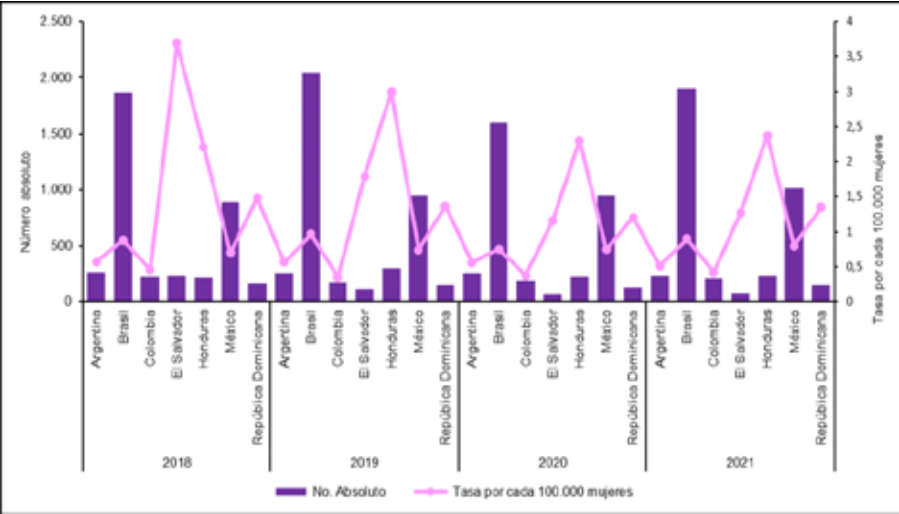
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Mamdani seals remarkable victory - but real challenges await



Zohran Mamdani, the newly elected mayor of New York City, is notable in many ways. He will become the city's youngest mayor since 1892, its first Muslim mayor and its first mayor born in Africa.

The 34-year-old entered the race last year with next to no name recognition, little money and no institutional party support.

That alone makes his victory over former Governor Andrew Cuomo and Republican nominee Curtis Sliwa remarkable.

But more than that, he represents the kind of politician that many in the Democratic Party's left have been seeking for years.

He is young and charismatic, with his generation's natural comfort with social media.

His ethnicity reflects the diversity of the party's base. He hasn't shied away from a political fight and has proudly espoused left-wing causes - such as free childcare, expanded public transportation and government intervention in free market systems.

Mamdani has also shown a laser-like ability to focus on the kind of core economic issues that have been a priority for working-class voters who have drifted from the Democratic Party recently, but he hasn't

disavowed the left's cultural principles.

But critics have warned that such a candidate is unelectable in broad swathes of America - and Republicans have gleefully held the self-avowed democratic socialist up as the far-left face of the Democratic Party. Still, on Tuesday night in New York City, he was a winner.

By running against and defeating Cuomo, a former New York governor who is himself the son of a governor, he has vanquished the entrenched Democratic establishment viewed by many on the left as woefully out of touch with their party and their nation.

Because of this, Mamdani's campaign for mayor has generated voluminous media attention, perhaps more than a municipal election, even one for America's largest city, deserves.

It also means that, as mayor, his successes - and failures - will be closely scrutinised.

Twelve years ago, Democrat Bill de Blasio won his race for mayor on a platform of addressing New York City's economic and social inequalities. Like Mamdani, Americans on the left had high hopes that his administration would provide a national example of effective liberal governance.

De Blasio, however, departed

office eight years later widely unpopular and with a mixed record of achievements as he struggled with the limits of his mayoral power to implement new policies.

Mamdani will have to grapple with those same limits - and those same expectations.

New York Governor Kathy Hochul, a fellow Democrat, has already said she opposed raising the kind of taxes necessary to fund Mamdani's ambitious agenda.

And even with sufficient funding, Mamdani would not be able to implement programmes unilaterally.

He campaigned as a sharp critic of the corporate and business elite that call New York City their home, and have made Manhattan the financial capital of the world. To effectively govern, he will probably have to make some form of peace with those interests, however - a process he has already begun in recent weeks.

He has also condemned Israel's conduct during the Gaza war and pledged to arrest Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu as a war criminal if he sets foot in New York City, a promise that could be tested at some point during his term.

All those are problems for a later date, however. For now, Mamdani will need to set about the task of defining himself on the

public stage - before his opponents do.

While his campaign has generated national attention, he is still a blank slate for much of America.

A recent CBS poll indicated that 46% of the American public were following the New York mayoral election "not closely at all". That provides both an opportunity and a challenge for Mamdani and the American left.

Conservatives from US President Donald Trump down will be trying to paint the newly elected mayor as a socialist menace, whose policies and priorities will bring ruin to America's largest city and present a danger if embraced by the nation as a whole.

They will amplify every stumble and highlight every negative economic indicator or crime statistic.

Trump, who has a personal connection to New York, is sure to welcome a political tussle with Mamdani and he has a wealth of ways to complicate life for the new mayor.

Mamdani will also be pressed to win over Democratic leaders, like New York senator and Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer, who never backed his campaign.

The opportunity for Mamdani, however, is that he is not burdened by his past, which his political opponents unsuccessfully tried to wield against him during the campaign.

When he is inaugurated in January, he will have the chance to build his political reputation from scratch.

And if Trump does feud with him, he will only give Mamdani a larger platform on which to work.

His political talent and abilities have taken him this far, which is no small feat. But that is nothing compared to the tests that await him in the years ahead.

New Yorkers like to think their city is the centre of the universe, but its mayoral race was not the only electoral contest taking place on Tuesday. In fact, in all likelihood it wasn't even Tuesday's best indication of the current electoral mood.

Both New Jersey and Virginia - states Democrat Kamala Harris narrowly carried against Trump in last year's presidential contest - held elections for governor. And in both cases, the Democrats won by more comfortable margins.

Of the two, the New Jersey contest was closer. Yet the results suggest the inroads Trump made in the state last year among working class and minority voters did not hold up without the president's name on the ballot.

Unlike Mamdani, Democrats Mikie Sherrill and Abigail Spanberger ran centrist campaigns with more modest policy prescriptions. All three, however, focused on affordability and cost-of-living issues. Exit polls showed the economy, once again, was the topic voters cared about most.

With Democrats winning on Tuesday, it may prove difficult for those looking to glean some insight on the kind of policies and candidates Democrats should advance to ensure future electoral success.

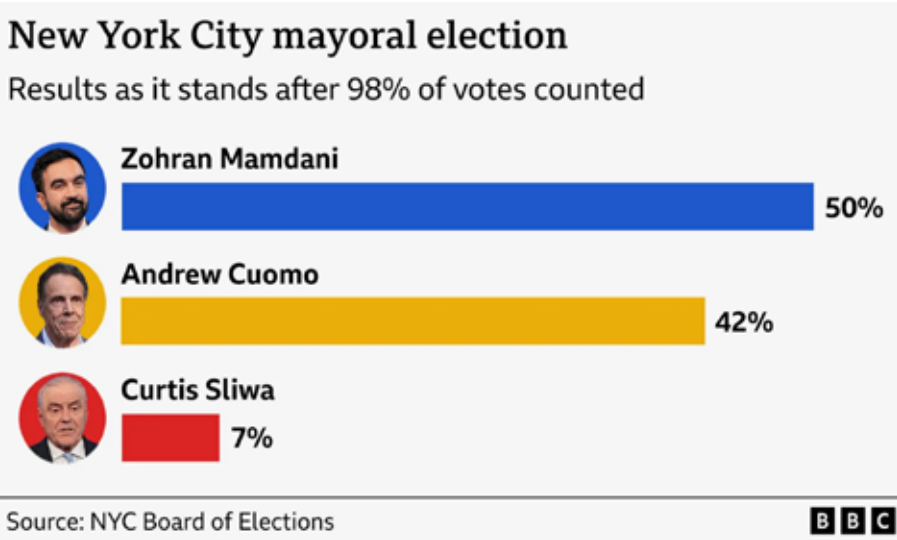
Last week, however, Mamdani insisted there was plenty of room in the party for all kinds of viewpoints.

"I think this has to be a party that actually allows Americans to see themselves in it and not just be a mirror image of just a few people who are engaged in politics," he said.

"To me, what binds all of us together is who we are fighting to serve, and that is working people."

That view will be put to test next year, as Democrats across the nation head to the polls to select their candidates for the congressional midterm elections. Tensions are sure to mount and traditional fault lines could re-emerge.

For one night, however, the Democrats are one big, happy party.





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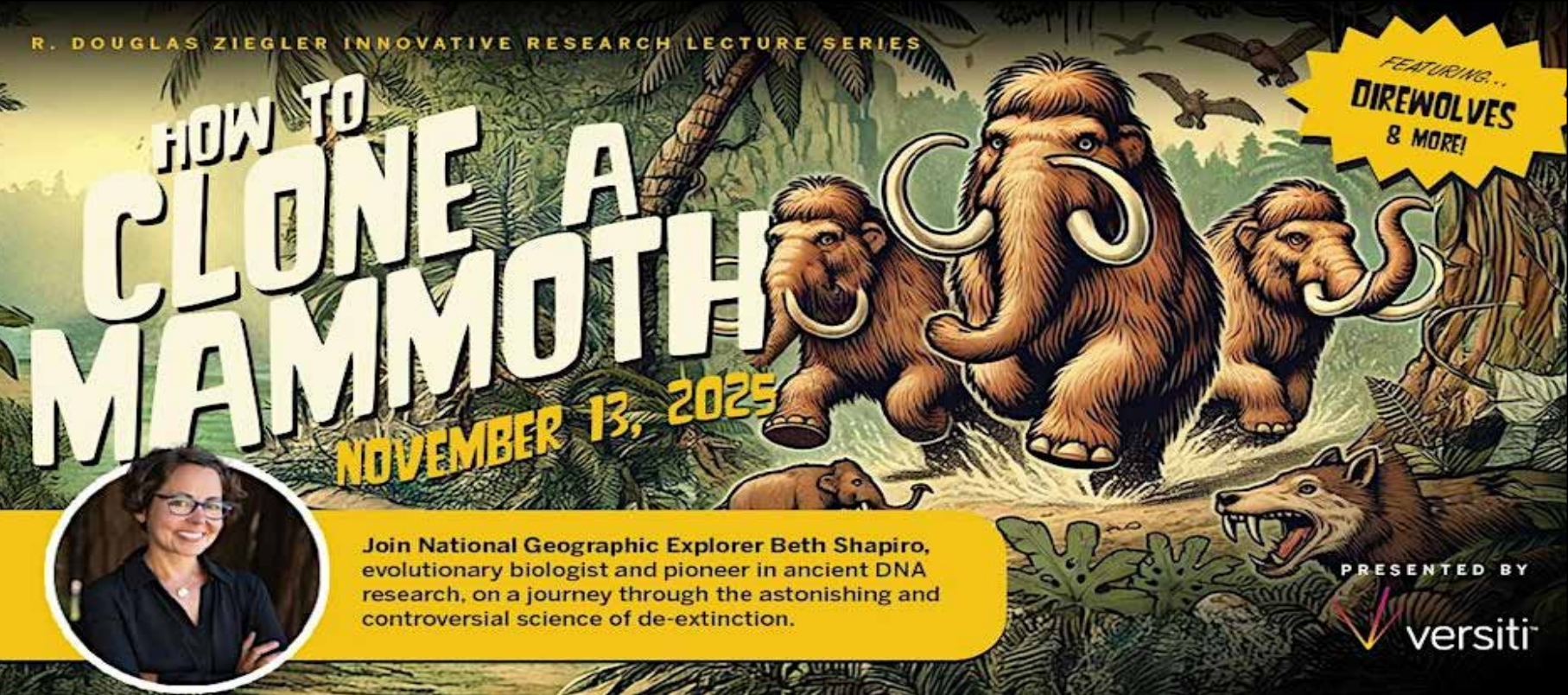
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MONTCLAIR, Nueva Jersey (AP)

— En una soleada mañana de otoño, niños con cascos y mochilas se reunieron con sus padres en Montclair, Nueva Jersey, para un paseo en bicicleta en grupo hasta dos escuelas primarias locales. Voluntarios con chalecos reflectantes naranjas se aseguraron de que todos los presentes en una zona comercial del barrio estuvieran listos antes de que los ciclistas iniciaran su ruta de 8 kilómetros (5 millas) en bicicleta.

Cada pocas cuadas, se unían más adultos y niños en bicicleta. Finalmente, el grupo superó las 350 personas. Los estudiantes mayores charlaban con sus amigos, mientras que los más pequeños se concentraban en pedalear. Los autos se detenían para dejar pasar a la fila de ciclistas. Algunos alumnos y padres se separaron del grupo antes de que el resto llegara a la parada final.

Es una escena típica de los viernes en Montclair. En los últimos tres años, lo que comenzó como un pequeño grupo de padres que querían animar a sus hijos a ir en bicicleta al colegio se ha convertido en un ritual semanal y en una opción habitual de transporte para muchas familias.

“¡Fue divertidísimo!”, exclamó la alumna Gigi Drucker al llegar a la escuela primaria Nishuane. “La mejor manera de ir a la escuela es en bicicleta, porque haces más ejercicio. Además, es más sano para el planeta”, añadió.

Pero ir al colegio en bicicleta no es solo por diversión, según la organizadora Jessica Tillyer. Cree

que ir juntos en bici cada semana ayuda a fomentar hábitos saludables en los niños y fortalece el sentido de comunidad entre los padres.

“Todo empezó porque un pequeño grupo de nosotros, unos cinco padres, queríamos llevar a nuestros hijos al colegio en bicicleta, pero sentíamos que no era seguro. Yo, por mi parte, me sentía un poco sola yendo sola al colegio. Así que el servicio de bicicletas compartidas surgió como una pequeña iniciativa. Y ahora podemos tener hasta 400 personas yendo juntas al colegio”, dijo Tillyer.

El movimiento de bicicletas-autobuses no es nuevo. Existen cientos de ellos en Estados Unidos y Europa, así como en Australia, Brasil, India, Indonesia e Israel, según Bike Bus World, una organización sin fines de lucro que promueve y brinda información sobre bicicletas-autobuses.

Sam Balto, cofundador de un servicio de bicicletas-autobús en Portland, Oregón, hace más de tres años, afirma que el interés ha crecido tanto que ofrece asesoramiento gratuito para ayudar a otros a lanzar sus propios proyectos. Calcula que existen más de 400 rutas en todo el mundo, y el número sigue aumentando.

“Los niños y las familias anhelan la comunidad, la actividad física y estar al aire libre. Y cuando se les presenta eso en lugar de una fila de autos para ir a la escuela, las personas se sienten naturalmente atraídas por algo que es súper alegre y está impulsado por la comunidad”, dijo

Balto.

Los organizadores esperan que el movimiento de autobuses para bicicletas no solo consiga que más niños usen la bicicleta, sino que también impulse a los funcionarios electos en Estados Unidos y en el extranjero a invertir en infraestructuras ciclistas más seguras.

Aunque poner en marcha un servicio de bicicletas compartidas no sea difícil, mantenerlo en funcionamiento durante todo el año, a lo largo de las diferentes estaciones, requiere más esfuerzo. Los organizadores de rutas exitosas compartieron consejos para los padres que desean crear la suya propia.

Planificar y comunicar

Andrew Hawkins, uno de los líderes de Montclair Bike Bus, explicó que una vez que suficientes familias muestran interés, el primer paso es planificar cuidadosamente una ruta. Esto implica identificar calles con poco tráfico y considerar cuántos estudiantes pueden unirse al grupo en el punto de partida y a lo largo del recorrido.

“Nos llevó un tiempo encontrar una ruta que nos convenciera, pero seguimos dispuestos a hacer ajustes si es necesario”, dijo Hawkins. “Las cosas pueden cambiar. Puede que nuevos grupos de estudiantes se muden a una manzana determinada, o que cambien los patrones de tráfico, y hay que adaptarse”.

El grupo de Montclair surgió gracias al boca a boca y las publicaciones en redes sociales. A

medida que aumentaba el número de participantes, los organizadores crearon un grupo de chat para coordinarse y compartir actualizaciones semanales. También se pusieron en contacto con otras familias a través de las AMPA, foros escolares y otros canales de comunicación para padres.

Varios padres comentaron que una ventaja inesperada es que el servicio de bicicletas-autobús motiva a los niños a levantarse y salir de casa más rápidamente los viernes por la mañana.

“Le entusiasmo más levantarse para ir en bicicleta que para ir en autobús normal. Así que, en realidad, me resulta más fácil prepararlo para ir al colegio”, dijo Gene Gykoff, quien acompañó a su hijo en bicicleta una mañana reciente.

Para mantener el impulso durante todo el año, el equipo del Montclair Bike Bus organiza paseos temáticos los fines de semana y días festivos. Estos eventos también permiten que las familias que no pueden unirse entre semana por las mañanas experimenten lo que ofrece el servicio de bicicletas antes de comprometerse con un horario regular.

Empieza joven y ve despacio.

El programa Montclair Bike Bus consta de varios grupos y rutas dirigidos por adultos que abarcan todas las escuelas primarias del municipio y dos de sus escuelas secundarias. Los organizadores consideran que los primeros años de primaria son cuando los niños se benefician más del ciclismo en grupo. Los alumnos de los primeros años de escuela pueden aprender a andar en bicicleta de forma segura y aplicar esas habilidades cuando van solos o en grupos

pequeños a medida que crecen.

Los padres de Montclair descubrieron que la mayoría de los alumnos de primaria pueden recorrer una distancia de 3 a 5 millas, y el grupo viaja a una velocidad de alrededor de 6 millas por hora para que los niños más pequeños puedan seguirles el ritmo.

“La baja velocidad puede resultar difícil para algunos de nuestros alumnos mayores que quieren ir un poco más rápido. Les decimos que no se permiten carreras en el autobús de bicicletas; todos llegan a la escuela al mismo tiempo. Pero ha habido ocasiones en las que hemos tenido que dividir el recorrido en dos grupos para que algunos de los alumnos mayores puedan ir un poco más rápido que los más pequeños”, dijo Hawkins.

Sé constante sin importar el clima

Para que el servicio de bicicletas compartidas funcione todo el año, se requiere constancia, lo que implica estar preparados para pedalear incluso cuando llueve o hace frío, explicaron Balto y Hawkins. Los responsables supervisan la previsión meteorológica y deciden si cancelar la salida del viernes por condiciones inseguras o si seguir adelante según lo previsto, recordando a las familias que se vistan adecuadamente.

“Conforme baja la temperatura, les decimos a todos que se aseguren de tener el equipo adecuado: guantes, braga para el cuello, chaquetas abrigadas”, dijo Hawkins. “La idea es que los niños se sientan cómodos montando en bicicleta durante todo el año”.

El servicio de bicicletas compartidas de Montclair consiguió chalecos reflectantes y

luces para bicicletas gracias a los patrocinadores, con el fin de aumentar la visibilidad en las oscuras mañanas de invierno. Los responsables también llevan herramientas básicas de mantenimiento, como bombas de aire para neumáticos.

Balto observó que el clima suele preocupar más a los adultos que a los niños. «Los niños quieren estar al aire libre con sus amigos», dijo. «Si van a hacer esto sin importar el clima, háganlo siempre. La gente se acostumbrará y empezará a unirse».

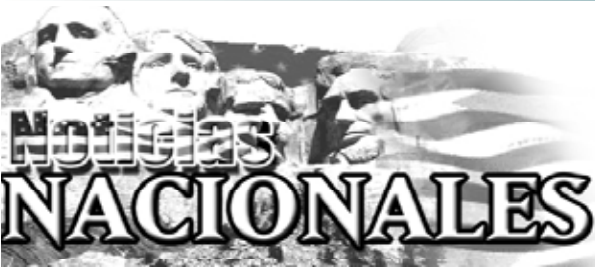

Democrats dominate as economic woes take a toll on Trump’s GOP.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Democrats dominated the first major Election Day since President Donald Trump returned to the White House.

And while a debate about the future of the Democratic Party may have only just begun, there are signs that the economy — specifically, Trump’s inability to deliver the economic turnaround he promised last fall — may be a real problem for Trump’s GOP heading into next year’s higher-stakes midterm elections.

Democrats on Tuesday won governor’s races in Virginia and New Jersey, the only states electing new chief executives this year. They also swept a trio of state Supreme Court contests in swing-state Pennsylvania and ballots measures from

Colorado to Maine.

Trump was largely absent from the campaign trail, but GOP candidates closely aligned themselves with the president, betting that his big win last year could provide a path to victory this time. They were wrong.

Democrats are hoping the off-year romp offers a new winning playbook, but some caution may be warranted. Tuesday’s elections were limited to a handful of states, most of which lean blue, and the party that holds the White House typically struggles in off-year elections.

Meanwhile, Republicans in Washington may be more excited than Democrats that a self-described democratic socialist will become New York City’s next

mayor.

Here’s some top takeaways:

A new Democratic playbook emerges

Former Rep. Abigail Spanberger will become Virginia’s next governor — and its first female chief executive — while Rep. Mikie Sherrill won the New Jersey governor’s office by running campaigns focused largely on the economy, public safety and health care.

Early results showed Democrats outperforming their margins from four years ago in fast-growing suburbs, rural areas and even places with high concentrations of military voters.

The Democrats won by actively distancing themselves from some of the Democratic Party’s far-left policies and emphasized what Spanberger described in her victory speech as “pragmatism over



partisanship.”

Agrowingcollection of Democratic leaders believe the moderate approach holds the key to the party’s revival after the GOP won the White House and both congressional chambers last year.

Above all, the Democrats in both states focused on rising costs such as groceries, energy and health care, which Trump has struggled to control.

In addition to tacking to the middle on economic issues, Spanberger and Sherrill downplayed their support for progressive priorities, including LGBTQ rights and resistance against Trump’s attack on American institutions.

Spanberger rarely even mentioned Trump’s name on the campaign trail.

Both also have resumes that appealed to the middle.

Spanberger is a former CIA case officer who spent years abroad working undercover, while Sherrill spent a decade as an active-duty helicopter pilot for the Navy before entering Congress. Both played up their public safety backgrounds as a direct response to the GOP’s attack that Democrats are soft on crime.

It’s (still) the economy, stupid

Trump and his Republican allies have been especially focused on immigration, crime and conservative

cultural issues.

But voters who decided Tuesday’s top elections were more concerned about the economy, jobs and costs of living. That’s according to the AP Voter Poll, an expansive survey of more than 17,000 voters in New Jersey, Virginia, California and New York City suggesting that many voters felt they can’t get ahead financially in today’s economy.

Ironically, the same economic anxieties helped propel Trump to the White House just one year ago. Now, the economic concerns appear to be undermining his party’s political goals in 2025 — and could be more problematic for the GOP in next year’s midterm elections, which will decide the balance of power for Trump’s final two years in office.

That’s even as Trump regularly brags about stock prices booming and boasted about leading a new renaissance of American manufacturing.

About half of Virginia voters said the economy was the most important issue facing their state while most New Jersey voters said either taxes or the economy were the top issue in their state. Just over half of New York City voters said cost of living was their top concern.

It was unclear whether kitchen table

concerns weighing so heavily on voters might help break the impasse that has prompted the government shutdown, which has spanned more than a month.

A referendum on Trump

This was the first election since Trump’s return to the presidency and voters rejected candidates and causes aligned with his Republican Party from Virginia and Pennsylvania to Maine and New Jersey. It was, in fact, difficult to point to any significant victory for Trump’s party.

They also expressed strong feelings about the direction of the country under his leadership.

About 6 in 10 voters in Virginia and New Jersey said they are “angry” or “dissatisfied” with the way things are going in the country today, according to the AP Voter Poll. Just one-third said they are “enthusiastic” or “satisfied.”

In a sign of the extent of the GOP’s struggles, Republicans lost the Virginia attorney general’s race to Democrat Jay Jones, who was forced to apologize after text messages surfaced weeks before Election Day in which he depicted the murder of political opponents.

Fearing a bad night, Trump tried to distance himself from the election results.

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Best Game 7 ever? There is a compelling case



Game 7 of the 2025 World Series was one of the wildest, and to some extent that's expressed as easily as "a deciding World Series game went to extra innings," which had happened just twice before in baseball history. When you're talking about things like "was that the best Game 7 ever?!", given the breadth of baseball history, you know you've seen something special; when you have a Game 7 in extra innings in the first place, you know you've seen some wild plays.

After all, the Series ended on just the third Series-ending double play in history, and first since 1947. For the rest of time, we're going

to be talking about the light-hitting middle infielder (Miguel Rojas) who hit the game-tying homer -- his first homer off a right-handed pitcher (excluding position players) in more than a year. We might also be talking about the other light-hitting middle infielder (Isiah Kiner-Falefa) who took a lead not quite long enough and missed scoring a Series-winning run by inches forever, too. It was that kind of World Series.

As you've probably come to expect by now, there's a way to rank and rate just about everything in baseball and life -- so what we're about to provide you may not come as a

shock. Given not only the in-game situation but the context of how deep into the playoffs we were, Saturday night had two of the top five most impactful plays in baseball history. It had the 11th, too -- and also the biggest out in history. The biggest out. In history.

So yes, the pressure you felt watching -- the joy or awe or dread, depending on what side of this one you were on -- is reflected by the numbers, too. Four of the top 15 most important plays in history happened just on Saturday night.

(How is this defined? Based on Baseball-Reference's "Championship Win

Probability," which takes the in-game win probability you're probably familiar with -- how much does a particular play contribute to a win based on the score, inning, outs, and runners at the time -- and combines it with adjustments for the point in the postseason you're in. A World Series Game 7 is more important than a World Series Game 1, which is more important than the third game of a Division Series, and so on.)

To show how that works, when Rojas hit his game-tying home run in the ninth inning, he earned +34.9% Championship Win Probability, which is the difference between how likely the Dodgers were to win the ring when he stepped to the plate and what it was after he blasted Jeff Hoffman's slider.

It was one of nine different plays where the title-winning odds moved by at least 15%. That includes the three homers you're thinking of, but also Ernie Clement flying out to Andy Pages in the ninth -- where a hit wins it

all -- and Pages and Daulton Varsho each grounding out with go-ahead runs being forced at the plate, and Mookie Betts' double play, and also Vladimir Guerrero Jr.'s leadoff double in the 11th, and Enrique Hernández grounding out with the bases loaded in a tied game in the 10th inning, and there was just so much happening here, all the time.

What that adds up to is this: That's the wildest game in baseball history, given the context of "a World Series Game 7," because no game had ever seen more than seven such plays. Games with most "massively impactful^" plays, MLB history

2) Tris Speaker, Red Sox, 1912 Game 8, +50.5%, (RBI single down 2-1 in the 10th, 1 out)

3) Tony Womack, D-backs, 2001 Game 7, +49.8% (RBI double down 2-1 in the 9th, 1 out)

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An engine fell off a UPS plane before a deadly crash and explosion in Kentucky, the NTSB says

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — A UPS cargo plane’s left wing caught fire and an engine fell off just before it crashed and exploded after takeoff in Kentucky, a federal investigator said Wednesday, offering the first official details about a disaster that killed at least 11 people, including a child.

First responders, meanwhile, searched for more victims, a day after the crash at UPS Worldport, the company’s global aviation hub in Louisville. It created an inferno that consumed the enormous aircraft and spread to nearby businesses.

After being cleared for takeoff, a large fire developed in the left wing, said Todd Inman, a member of the National Transportation Safety Board, which is leading the investigation.

The plane gained enough altitude to clear the fence at the end of the runway before crashing just outside Louisville Muhammad Ali International Airport, Inman told reporters.

Airport security video “shows the left engine detaching from the wing during the takeoff roll,” he said.

The cockpit voice recorder and data recorder were recovered, and the engine was discovered on the airfield, Inman said.

“There are a lot of different parts of this airplane in a lot of different places,” he said, describing a debris field that stretched for half a mile.

A chain reaction The plane with three people aboard crashed about 5:15 p.m. Tuesday as it was departing for Honolulu from UPS Worldport at the Louisville airport.

The crash had a

ripple effect, striking and causing smaller explosions at Kentucky Petroleum Recycling and hitting an auto salvage yard, Grade A Auto Parts. Gov. Andy Beshear said the child who died was with a parent at the parts business.

He earlier said it was a “blessing” that the plane did not hit a nearby Ford Motor factory or the convention center.

U.S. Rep. Morgan McGarvey, D-Ky., praised firefighters who rushed headfirst to the disaster scene, describing it as “hotter than hell and raining down oil.”

Some people who heard the boom, saw the smoke and smelled burning fuel were still stunned a day later.

“I didn’t know if we were getting attacked. I didn’t know what was going on,” said Summer Dickerson, who works nearby.

The number of victims is unclear

Beshear again predicted the death toll would grow, noting that 16 families had gathered at a reunification center for news of loved ones.

“I don’t know how many victims we’re actually looking for,” said Mark Little, chief of the Okolona Fire District in Louisville. “That’s one of the issues, and the debris zone is so large. Some of that debris is going to have to be moved and searched underneath. It will take us quite awhile.”

University of Louisville Hospital said two people were in critical condition in the burn unit Wednesday. Eighteen people were treated and discharged at that hospital or other health care centers.

The airport is 7 miles (11.2 kilometers) from downtown Louisville,



close to the Indiana state line, residential areas, a water park and museums. The airport resumed operations on Wednesday, with at least one runway open.

Beshear said he didn’t know the status of the three UPS crew members aboard the McDonnell Douglas MD-11 made in 1991. It wasn’t clear if they were being counted among the dead.

‘We all know somebody who works at UPS’

UPS said it was “terribly saddened.” The Louisville package handling facility is the company’s largest. The hub employs more than 20,000 people in the region, handles 300 flights daily and sorts more than 400,000 packages an hour.

“We all know somebody who works at UPS,” Louisville Metro Council member Betsy Ruhe said.

The governor said The Team Kentucky Emergency Relief Fund, typically used to help people in natural disasters, is accepting donations to help with funeral expenses and other hardships.

“In Kentucky, we grieve together and we support one another,”

Beshear said.

Hoping for information about missing loved ones

Eric Richardson stood outside a police training academy, where people gathered waiting for word of their missing loved ones Tuesday night. He said his girlfriend, who had been at a metal recycling business near the explosion, wasn’t answering her phone. Her phone’s live location said she was still there.

Bobby Whelan, Richardson’s friend, had been in front of her in line, but had left minutes before the explosion.

“We don’t even want to think about anything but the best,” Whelan said. “All our friends were there.”

Tom Brooks Jr., who runs a recycling business, said the crash

“just rocked the whole place.”

Destyn Mitchell was working as a host at an Outback restaurant close to the airport when she heard a loud boom.

“People who just sat down to eat got up and left in under 30 minutes and packed up their food because they wanted to hurry up and get home,” she said.

What happened to the plane?

Flight records show the plane was on the ground in San Antonio from Sept. 3 to Oct. 18.

Jeff Guzzetti, a former federal crash investigator, said a number of different things could have caused the fire as the UPS plane was rolling down the runway.

“It could have been the engine partially

coming off and ripping out fuel lines. Or it could have been a fuel leak igniting and then burning the engine off. It’s just too soon to tell,” said Guzzetti who investigated crashes for the NTSB and the Federal Aviation Administration.

He said the crash bears a lot of similarities to a crash in 1979 when the left engine fell off an American Airlines jet as it was departing Chicago’s O’Hare International Airport, killing 273 people.

Guzzetti said this UPS plane and the American plane were equipped with the same General Electric engines. The 1979 crash involved a DC-10, but the MD-11 UPS plane is based on the DC-10.





Hizo su fortuna vendiendo camellos y oro. Ahora este señor de la guerra controla la mitad de Sudán.

Mohamed Hamdan Dagolo, conocido como “Hemedti”, se ha erigido como una figura dominante en la escena política de Sudán, y sus Fuerzas de Apoyo Rápido (RSF) paramilitares controlan ahora la mitad del país.

Las RSF consiguieron una notable victoria recientemente al tomar por asalto la ciudad de El Fasher, la última guarnición en manos del ejército sudanés y sus aliados locales en la región occidental de Darfur.

Los residentes de El-Fasher están sufriendo hambruna tras el asedio de 18 meses de la ciudad por parte de las RSF, según confirmó el lunes un grupo de expertos en seguridad alimentaria acreditado por la ONU.

Temido y odiado por sus adversarios, Hemedti es admirado por sus seguidores por su tenacidad, su crueldad y su promesa de derrocar a un estado desacreditado.

Hemedti tiene orígenes humildes. Su familia pertenece a la sección Mahariya de la comunidad Rizeigat, de habla árabe y dedicada al pastoreo de camellos, que se extiende por Chad y Darfur.

Nació en 1974 o 1975; como ocurre con muchos procedentes de entornos rurales, su fecha y lugar de nacimiento no quedaron registrados.

Liderados por su tío Juma Dagolo, su clan se trasladó a Darfur en los años 70 y 80, huyendo de la guerra y buscando mejores oportunidades, y se les permitió establecerse allí.

Tras abandonar la escuela en su

adolescencia temprana, Hemedti ganó dinero comerciando con camellos a través del desierto hacia Libia y Egipto.

En aquel momento, Darfur era el lejano oeste de Sudán: pobre, sin ley y abandonada por el gobierno del entonces presidente Omar al-Bashir.

Milicianos árabes conocidos como Janjaweed, incluyendo una fuerza comandada por Juma Dagolo, estaban atacando las aldeas del grupo étnico indígena Fur.

Este ciclo de violencia desembocó en una rebelión a gran escala en 2003, en la que a los combatientes de Fur se unieron Masalit, Zaghawa y otros grupos, que afirmaban haber sido ignorados por la élite árabe del país.

En respuesta, Bashir expandió enormemente a las Janjaweed para liderar sus esfuerzos de contrainsurgencia. Rápidamente se hicieron tristemente célebres por quemar, saquear, violar y matar.

La unidad de Hemedti se encontraba entre ellas, y un informe de las fuerzas de paz de la Unión Africana afirma que atacó y destruyó la aldea de Adwa en noviembre de 2004, matando a 126 personas, entre ellas 36 niños.

Una investigación estadounidense determinó que los Janjaweed fueron responsables de genocidio.

El conflicto de Darfur fue remitido a la Corte Penal Internacional (CPI), que presentó cargos contra cuatro hombres, entre ellos Bashir, quien ha negado haber perpetrado un genocidio.

Hemedti era uno de los muchos comandantes Janjaweed

considerados demasiado jóvenes para estar en el punto de mira del fiscal en aquel momento.

Solo uno, el “coronel de coroneles” Janjaweed, Ali Abdel Rahman Kushayb, fue llevado ante el tribunal.

El mes pasado fue declarado culpable de 27 cargos de crímenes de guerra y crímenes contra la humanidad y será sentenciado el 19 de noviembre.

En los años posteriores al punto álgido de la violencia en 2004, Hemedti jugó sus cartas hábilmente, llegando a convertirse en jefe de una poderosa fuerza paramilitar, un imperio corporativo y una maquinaria política.

Es una historia de oportunismo y espíritu emprendedor. Se amotinó brevemente, exigiendo el pago de los salarios atrasados de sus soldados, ascensos y un cargo político para su hermano. Bashir le concedió casi todo lo que pedía y Hemedti se reincorporó al grupo.

Más tarde, cuando otras unidades Janjaweed se amotinaron, Hemedti lideró las fuerzas gubernamentales que las derrotaron, tomando en el proceso el control de la mina de oro artesanal más grande de Darfur, en un lugar llamado Jebel Amir.

Rápidamente, la empresa familiar de Hemedti, Al-Gunaid, se convirtió en la mayor exportadora de oro de Sudán.

En 2013, Hemedti solicitó —y obtuvo— el estatus formal de jefe de un nuevo grupo paramilitar, las RSF, que reportaba directamente a Bashir.

Los Janjaweed fueron integrados en las RSF, recibiendo nuevos uniformes, vehículos y armas, y también oficiales del ejército



regular que fueron traídos para ayudar con la modernización.

Las RSF consiguieron una importante victoria contra los rebeldes de Darfur, tuvieron menos éxito en la lucha contra la insurgencia en las montañas Nuba, adyacentes a Sudán del Sur, y obtuvieron un subcontrato para vigilar la frontera con Libia.

Con el pretexto de frenar la migración ilícita desde África a través del desierto hasta el Mediterráneo, los comandantes de Hemedti también destacaron en la extorsión y, según se informa, en el tráfico de personas.

En 2015, Arabia Saudita y los Emiratos Árabes Unidos (EAU) pidieron al ejército sudanés que enviara tropas para luchar contra los hutíes en Yemen.

El contingente estaba comandado por un general que había luchado en Darfur, Abdel Fattah al-Burhan, ahora jefe del ejército en guerra con las RSF.

Hemedti vio una oportunidad y negoció un acuerdo privado aparte con Arabia Saudí y los Emiratos Árabes Unidos para proporcionar mercenarios a las RSF.

La conexión con Abu Dabi resultó ser de suma importancia. Fue el comienzo de una estrecha relación con

el presidente emiratí, Mohamed bin Zayed.

Jóvenes sudaneses —y cada vez más también de países vecinos— acudían en masa a los centros de reclutamiento de las RSF para recibir pagos en efectivo de hasta 6.000 dólares (4.500 libras esterlinas) al inscribirse.

Hemedti estableció una alianza con el Grupo Wagner de Rusia, recibiendo formación a cambio de negocios, incluso relacionados con el oro.

Visitó Moscú para formalizar el acuerdo y estuvo allí el día en que Rusia invadió Ucrania. Tras el estallido de la guerra en Sudán, negó que las RSF estuvieran recibiendo ayuda de Wagner.

Aunque las principales unidades de combate de las RSF se estaban profesionalizando cada vez más, también abarcaban una coalición de milicias étnicas irregulares de corte tradicional.

Ante el creciente número de protestas populares que azotaban al régimen, Bashir ordenó a las unidades de Hemedti que se dirigieran a la capital, Jartum.

Jugando con su nombre, el presidente lo apodó himayti, “mi protector”, viendo a las RSF como un contrapeso a los

potenciales golpistas en el ejército regular y la seguridad nacional.

Fue un error de cálculo. En abril de 2019, un animado campamento de manifestantes civiles rodeó el cuartel general militar exigiendo democracia.

Bashir ordenó al ejército abrir fuego contra ellos. Los generales de mayor rango —entre ellos Hemedti— se reunieron y decidieron derrocar a Bashir. El movimiento democrático lo celebró.

Durante un tiempo, Hemedti fue aclamado como el rostro fresco del futuro de Sudán. Joven, afable, siempre dispuesto a reunirse con diversos grupos sociales y posicionándose como el rival del establishment histórico del país, intentó cambiar su imagen política. Pero aquello duró apenas unas semanas.

Mientras él y el jefe conjunto del consejo militar gobernante, Burhan, postergaban la entrega del poder a los civiles, los manifestantes intensificaron sus protestas y Hemedti desató a las RSF, que mataron a cientos de personas, violaron a mujeres y arrojaron a hombres al río Nilo

con ladrillos atados a los tobillos, según un informe del grupo de campaña Human Rights Watch (HRW).

Affordable Health Coverage Still Available to Milwaukee Families

Despite the ongoing federal shutdown, residents can still access health insurance through the Affordable Care Act (ACA) Marketplace. MHD's Community Healthcare Access Program (CHAP) continues to help individuals and families compare plans, apply for subsidies, and enroll before the January 15 deadline. While premiums are expected to rise nationwide, federal tax credits and cost-sharing reductions remain available to help offset costs. MHD encourages people to review their options and update their information to ensure they receive the correct level of support. CHAP counselors offer free, in-person assistance to guide residents through the process. Learn more at milwaukee.gov/CHAP or call (414) 286-8620. MHD continues to encourage people in Milwaukee to stay informed and support their neighbors.

AARP: Prevenir Caídas/Resbones en Casa

Las caídas son más frecuentes en los adultos mayores, pero muchas de ellas se pueden prevenir. Una caída puede provocar lesiones graves, discapacidad o incluso la muerte. Lo que debilita nuestro equilibrio viene con la edad mayor (o a nuestros seres queridos, como nuestros padres), la vista, audición, fuerza muscular, coordinación y reflejos cambian. Algunas afecciones de salud, como la diabetes, las enfermedades cardíacas, los problemas circulatorios y las deficiencias de vitamina D, pueden afectar el equilibrio.

Una de cada tres personas mayores de 65 años sufre una caída cada año. ¡Usted (o su ser querido) no tiene por qué ser uno de ellos! Hay cosas que puede hacer para reducir el riesgo de caídas.

1- ZAPATOS: asegúrese de que sus zapatos le quedan bien, tienen suelas antideslizantes y están en buen estado (¿Por qué tacones altos?).

2- PREVENCIÓN DE CAÍDAS/ RESBALONES EN EL HOGAR: la mitad de las caídas se producen en el hogar y la mayoría de ellas ocurren al realizar actividades cotidianas. Muchas de estas caídas/resbalones, y las lesiones resultantes, se pueden prevenir corrigiendo los posibles peligros dentro y alrededor del hogar.

3- EJERCICIO (con la aprobación de su médico): comience un programa regular de ejercicio/equilibrio.

4- PÍLDORAS: hable con su proveedor de atención médica sobre sus recetas y otros artículos de farmacia, ya que algunos medicamentos pueden contribuir al aumento de las caídas.

5- VISTA: la mala visión puede provocar problemas de equilibrio. Asegúrese de que su vista sea lo mejor posible.

Ahora que conoce los cinco pasos a prevenir las caídas (calzado, caídas en la casa/ resbalones, ejercicio, medicamentos y visión) que puede seguir y a qué debe prestar atención para prevenir las caídas. Revise su hogar de vez en cuando. Tenga cuidado y mantenga su hogar bien iluminado y en buen estado. Elija una medida a mantener su independencia, vivir de forma más segura y cómoda, y mantenerse firme sobre sus pies.



Community gathers to honor Sade Robinson with memorial at Warinmont Park

CUDAHY, Wis.— A crowd of family members, friends and community supporters gathered Sunday at Warnimont Park to honor the life of 19-year-old Sade Robinson, 19 months after her death shook Milwaukee and surrounding communities.

A memorial bench and trees were unveiled at the park—a site tied to the investigation into her killing. This space was transformed into one of remembrance and healing.

Sade’s mother, Sheena Scarborough, led the ceremony, thanking supporters and acknowledging the emotional journey since losing her daughter. She said the day marked another step in turning a location once connected to grief into a place where Sade’s spirit can be celebrated and comfort can be found.

“There’s a lot of heavy negative energy here. It affected the entire community throughout the trial, but we all had to endure and walk through together,” Scarborough said. “It has been unsurreal to know that something like this will happen to an angel such as my baby. She gave to so many. She loved so many. She’s forever with me. She helped me, too. She’s been guiding me throughout this entire process. She guides me throughout everything that I’m doing in her life, her legacy, through our foundation.”

Robinson’s death led to widespread heartbreak, calls for justice and conversations about young Black women’s safety.

Sunday’s gathering focused not on the crime, but on Sade’s life and the new memorial space created in her honor. Loved ones placed flowers and shared memories, while community members reflected on the support shown throughout the case and trial.

The bench features a magenta plaque with a picture of Robinson, and the words: “Still Sade rises spiritually saving lives.” After the ceremony, Scarborough handed out two surprise scholarships to youth who have made positive contributions to the Milwaukee community.

The memorial bench sits surrounded by newly planted trees. A symbol organizers said, of Sade’s lasting impact and the community’s commitment to remembering her beyond tragedy. You can visit this memorial any time at Warnimont Park in Cudahy.

Maxwell Anderson, the Milwaukee man convicted of killing Robinson is serving life in prison for her murder.

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Milwaukee County Executive David Crowley and Local Leaders Highlight Federal Government Shutdown Impacts to Community

MILWAUKEE – Open Enrollment period begins November 1. Today at the Marcia P. Cogg Health and Human Services Building, Milwaukee County Executive David Crowley joined Congresswoman Gwen Moore, Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson, and local leaders and stakeholders to raise awareness around the negative impacts of the ongoing federal government shutdown – now the second longest in U.S. history – on Milwaukee County and Wisconsin residents and families.

“Milwaukee County is strong and resilient, but the health and wellbeing of our residents and families should never be casualties of political fights in Washington,” said County Executive Crowley. “Until this federal shutdown ends, we will do what we always do: look out for our neighbors and step up to help in times of need. I’m grateful to all our community partners and encourage every resident who is able to join us in caring for our community.”

Beginning November 1, recipients of Wisconsin FoodShare assistance are in danger losing critical food assistance. This delay in FoodShare payments will leave more than 230,000 Milwaukee County residents uncertain about how they will put food on the table for their families and children, with no clear end in sight.

Additionally, Affordable Care Act (ACA) tax credits are set to expire at the end of the year, causing health care premiums to double or triple as the taken from them. Enough is enough.”

Across the county and state, leaders are working together to identify creative solutions to support one another as they navigate this tumultuous time. Milwaukee County and the City of Milwaukee have teamed up to host a unified Milwaukee County/City Food Drive, in partnership with NourishMKE and Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin. The food drive will continue until December, Section 8 housing benefits will also be at risk. Without this federal assistance, Milwaukee County DHHS Housing Services may not have the funds it needs to pay its federally mandated portion of rent costs, placing a huge financial burden on both vulnerable tenants and small-scale landlords.

“I have been clear as day: no one wins in a shutdown. Republicans and Donald Trump need to finally come to the table to end this shutdown and lower health care costs for families,” said U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin. “Wisconsin families just want to live a comfortable life where they can put food on the table, afford their health care and monthly bills, and not have Washington politics butting into their life. While Wisconsin’s House Republicans are on day 42 of a paid vacation and President Trump is just coming home from another foreign trip, Wisconsinites are going to wake up tomorrow to find their health care premiums are skyrocketing and food assistance is being districts All City of Wisconsin, including rural areas. SNAP is a lifeline, not a political weapon.”

Residents who would prefer to contribute financially can donate online to NourishMKE or Feeding America. More information on the food drive, as well as resources for residents who are experiencing food insecurity, is available online at county.milwaukee.gov/FoodAssistance.

“This hunger crisis did not have to happen. The Trump administration is purposefully withholding \$5 billion in contingency funding, so they can inflict maximum pain and hardship on the American people,” said Congresswoman Gwen Moore. “Unlike what Republicans claim, this won’t only hurt my district, but their constituents throughout federal employees have been furloughed from their jobs or are working without a paycheck. At Mitchell International Airport, federal TSA and FAA employees continue to work without pay to keep travelers safe. The VA Regional Benefits Office in Milwaukee is currently closed to the public due to furloughed employees. And federal representatives from FEMA and the SBA who have been in Milwaukee for months are now working without a paycheck so they can continue helping residents recover from the August storms. The livelihoods of dedicated public servants and working families in Milwaukee County are at stake if the federal government cannot come to the table and end this shutdown. Many

The government shutdown is now the longest in U.S. history. See how it compares



NPR The ongoing government shutdown entered its 36th full day on Wednesday, which officially makes it the longest in U.S. history. It takes the title from the most recent shutdown, which stretched from December 2018 to January 2019 during the first Trump administration. That impasse started with Democrats' refusal to fund President Trump's southern border wall. It ended — 35 days and an estimated \$3 billion in lost GDP later — after a series of escalating disruptions, including to air travel, put pressure on Trump and Republicans in Congress to reach a compromise. This time around, the government shuttered on Oct. 1 after Congress failed to break a stalemate over funding negotiations. More than a month later, an end to the stalemate appears nowhere in sight. There have been 20 “funding gaps” since Congress introduced the modern budget process in 1976, according to

the Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget, but many of those were only a few days long. Before now, only three funding lapses shut down the government for more than two weeks — and they were all within the last 30 years. (There was another shutdown in 1978, but that was before funding gaps halted government operations the way they do today.) While Republicans control both chambers, they need 60 votes to pass a spending bill in the Senate. Democrats are using that as leverage to push for an extension of Affordable Care Act subsidies that are due to expire at the end of this year, potentially leaving millions of Americans without health insurance. Republicans have said they are open to talks on the subsidies — but only after the government reopens. In the meantime, both parties are pointing the finger at each other and doing little, at least publicly, to reopen the government. The Senate has now tried — and failed — 14 times to pass a House-approved stopgap funding bill. The House, meanwhile, has been out of session since the shutdown began. Americans are feeling the worsening impacts every day. Over 1 million federal workers are working without paychecks. Another roughly 600,000 have been furloughed, and although a 2019 law ensures they are entitled to backpay after the shutdown is over, recent comments by President Trump have left many worried about whether that will still happen. Air traffic control shortages have caused delays and disruptions at airports across the country. National park sites are reducing operations and Smithsonian museums are closed. The IRS furloughed nearly half its staff, creating delays in taxpayer services. Tens of thousands of children from low-income families are now at risk of losing access to the Head Start program. And, federal benefits such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) stopped over the weekend, prompting widespread outcry and pushback from two federal judges. In response, the Trump administration says it will restart those payments — but they will be delayed and may only be for half the amount people typically get. In a weekend interview with CBS News, Trump continued to place blame on Democrats, and called on Senate Republicans to end the filibuster to bypass Democrats altogether. Senate Republicans have rejected that plea. Trump acknowledged that his involvement helped bring an end to the previous shutdown, but didn't appear as willing to compromise this time: “I’m not gonna do it by being extorted by the Democrats who have lost their way.”

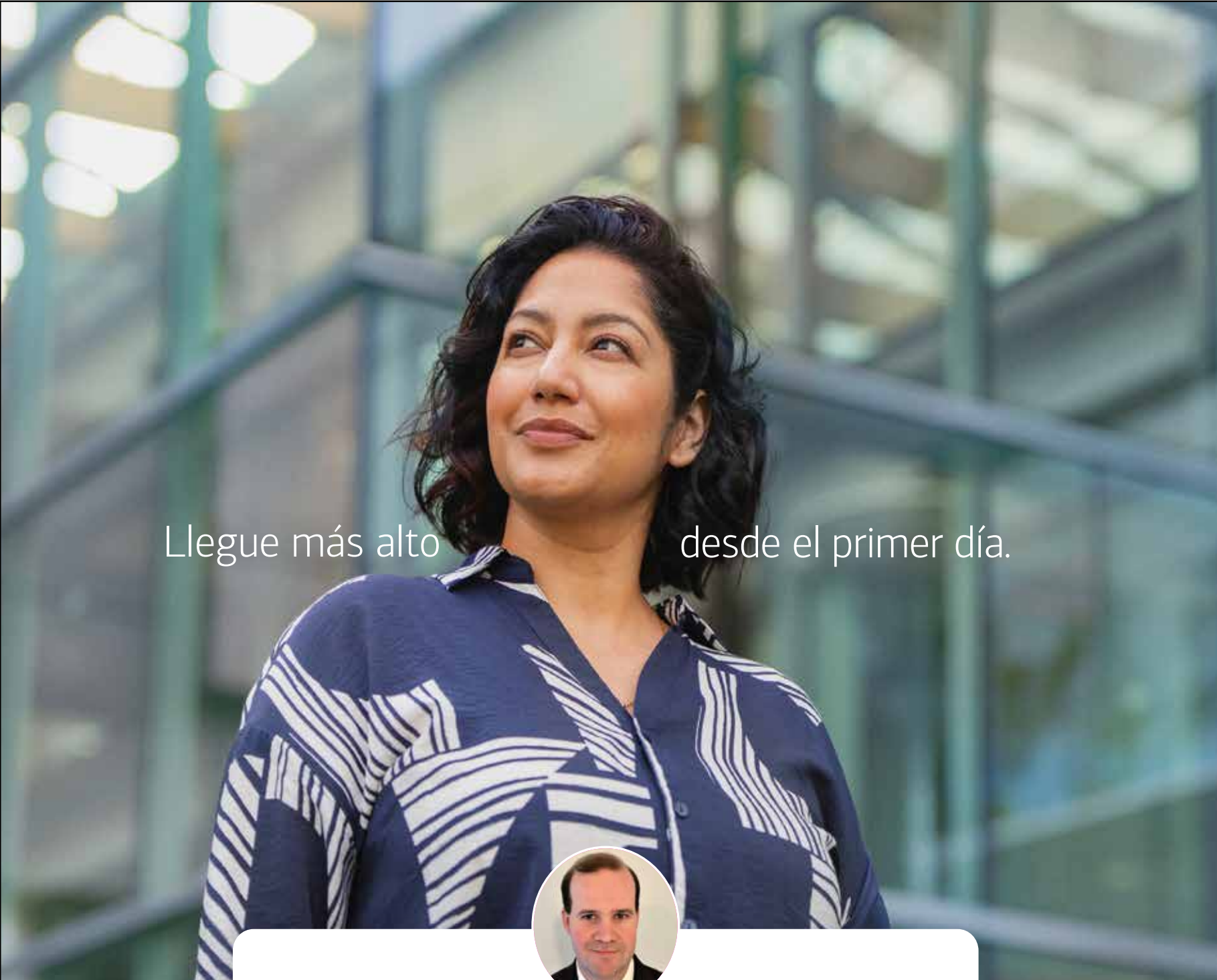
