



Disaster Recovery Center Opening in Milwaukee County



MILWAUKEE – (FEMA) U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) and Wisconsin Emergency Management (WEM) will open tomorrow in Milwaukee County to assist individuals who have uninsured losses or emergency needs related to the April 13–23, 2026, storms and flooding. At the Milwaukee County DRC, impacted residents can speak to representatives from the Federal Emergency Management Agency. The center will

open Tuesday, July 21, 2026, and will remain open until further notice. Locations and hours are as follows:

Those visiting

the DRC can enter through the front entrance and take the stairs down to the lower level. Individuals unable to use stairs should enter through the back entrance and ring the doorbell for access to the elevator. Signage will be available to help direct visitors. FEMA financial assistance may include money for

basic home repairs, personal property losses or other uninsured disaster-related needs such as childcare, transportation, medical needs, funeral, or dental expenses. Milwaukee County survivors who apply for FEMA assistance will receive a letter by mail or on their DisasterAssistance.gov account. If the letter says you “cannot be approved” for some categories of assistance, it does not mean that you have not been approved for assistance. It is important to read the letter carefully as it will explain your application status and advise what you need to do to continue the process. You are not required to go to a Disaster Recovery Center to receive FEMA assistance. The fastest way to apply is by going online at

DisasterAssistance.gov or the Spanish language DisasterAssistance.gov/es. You can also call 800-621-3362. After applying, create an online account at DisasterAssistance.gov or DisasterAssistance.gov/es to check your status tracker for updates and upload documents requested by FEMA to move your application forward. Wisconsin State Fair Gears Up for 175th Anniversary Celebration

WEST ALLIS, Wis. — The countdown is on for one of Wisconsin’s biggest summer traditions as the 2026 Wisconsin State Fair prepares to welcome hundreds of thousands of visitors for its historic 175th anniversary celebration. The annual event will run from Thursday, Aug. 6, through Sunday, Aug. 16, at Wisconsin State Fair Park in West Allis. 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Sheinbaum responde a críticas de funcionario de EE. UU. y actualiza evaluación sobre el fracking

CIUDAD DE MÉXICO — La presidenta de México, Claudia Sheinbaum, rechazó este martes las declaraciones del subjefe de gabinete de la Casa Blanca, Stephen Miller, quien aseguró que el sistema de justicia, el sistema político y el marco legal de México “no funcionan” debido a que parte del territorio estaría bajo el control de organizaciones criminales. Durante su conferencia matutina, la mandataria evitó entrar en una confrontación directa y aseguró que la relación entre ambos países mantiene una coordinación institucional.

Las declaraciones de Miller se producen en un momento de tensión en la relación bilateral entre México y Estados Unidos, particularmente por los temas de seguridad, migración y comercio. El funcionario estadounidense afirmó la semana pasada que los cárteles mexicanos no solo introducen narcóticos a Estados Unidos, sino que también exportan organizaciones criminales sofisticadas que buscan debilitar el Estado de derecho en territorio estadounidense.

Ante esos comentarios, Sheinbaum respondió que su gobierno no entrará en un debate con el funcionario norteamericano y reiteró que México es una nación democrática donde las decisiones las toma el pueblo.

“Hay buena coordinación con Estados Unidos. Ellos saben que en México gobierna el pueblo; nadie más gobierna”, expresó la presidenta durante su conferencia en Palacio Nacional.

La mandataria subrayó que su

administración trabaja diariamente para fortalecer la seguridad y construir la paz en el país, asegurando que existen resultados concretos derivados de las estrategias implementadas por su gobierno.

Al ser cuestionada sobre el motivo de las declaraciones de Miller, Sheinbaum consideró que podrían estar relacionadas con el proceso electoral estadounidense, ya que en noviembre se celebrarán elecciones intermedias.

“Hemos dicho siempre que México no debe convertirse en un elemento central de las campañas políticas en Estados Unidos”, afirmó.

También sostuvo que el gobierno estadounidense debe enfocarse en atender problemas internos relacionados con el consumo de drogas, la distribución de narcóticos y las operaciones de lavado de dinero dentro de su propio territorio.

Caso Ernesto Ruffo

Durante la conferencia también fue abordado el proceso judicial que enfrenta el exgobernador de Baja California, Ernesto Ruffo Appel, quien está acusado de delincuencia organizada, robo de combustible y evasión fiscal.

La presidenta respondió a un pronunciamiento firmado por 25 exmandatarios y líderes políticos de España y América Latina —entre ellos los expresidentes mexicanos Vicente Fox y Felipe Calderón— quienes calificaron el caso como un ejemplo de persecución política.

La mandataria rechazó esa interpretación

y sostuvo que el expediente tiene un carácter exclusivamente penal.

“Sería muy bueno que quienes firmaron ese documento revisaran las pruebas presentadas por la Fiscalía General de la República. No es un asunto político; es un asunto relacionado con presuntos delitos”, declaró.

Añadió que, de acuerdo con las investigaciones de la Fiscalía, Ruffo enfrenta acusaciones respaldadas por evidencia y que corresponde a las autoridades judiciales determinar su responsabilidad.

La presidenta insistió en que el proceso debe analizarse desde el punto de vista legal y no político, afirmando que quienes lo presentan como un caso de persecución están equivocados.

Avanza análisis sobre el fracking

Otro de los temas relevantes abordados en la conferencia fue la evaluación que realiza un comité de especialistas sobre la viabilidad del llamado “fracking sustentable” en México.

Sheinbaum explicó que el grupo de expertos fue ampliado para incorporar nuevas perspectivas antes de emitir una recomendación definitiva.

Según detalló, se integraron especialistas que históricamente han mantenido posturas contrarias a la explotación de gas mediante fracturación hidráulica, así como académicos encargados de desarrollar escenarios sobre el futuro energético del país y la incorporación de fuentes alternativas de energía.

La mandataria señaló que esta ampliación retrasó ligeramente la presentación de los resultados, aunque aseguró que los trabajos ya registran avances importantes.

Indicó que los integrantes del comité incluso han alcanzado consensos en varios aspectos técnicos y actualmente trabajan en la evaluación final de las necesidades energéticas nacionales hacia los años 2035 y 2040.

El estudio analiza cómo podría reducirse la dependencia del gas natural mediante otras fuentes de energía y cuáles serían las condiciones necesarias para que el fracking pudiera desarrollarse de manera segura y sustentable.

Sheinbaum informó que el informe final podría concluir la próxima semana y que el gobierno estaría en condiciones de presentar públicamente las conclusiones una o dos semanas después.



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Noticias de México

Los ingresos por exportaciones de México aumentan 25% en lo que va del año

Los ingresos por exportaciones mexicanas han registrado un crecimiento cercano al 25% en lo que va del año, impulsados por el sólido desempeño de los sectores manufacturero, automotriz y agroalimentario, según datos recientes del gobierno federal y organismos económicos.

El aumento refleja una mayor demanda de productos mexicanos en los mercados internacionales, especialmente en Estados Unidos, principal socio comercial del país bajo el Tratado entre México, Estados Unidos y Canadá (T-MEC).

Especialistas señalan que el crecimiento también ha sido favorecido por el proceso de nearshoring, mediante el cual empresas internacionales han trasladado parte de su producción a México para acercarse al mercado estadounidense y reducir costos logísticos.

Las exportaciones manufactureras continúan siendo el principal motor del comercio exterior, encabezadas por la industria automotriz, la fabricación de maquinaria, equipos electrónicos y dispositivos médicos. Asimismo, los productos agroalimentarios mexicanos mantienen una fuerte presencia en mercados internacionales.

Analistas consideran que el incremento fortalece las perspectivas de crecimiento económico para el país durante 2026, aunque advierten que persisten desafíos como la desaceleración económica mundial, las tensiones comerciales y

la incertidumbre en los mercados financieros.

El gobierno mexicano ha señalado que continuará impulsando inversiones, infraestructura y acuerdos comerciales para consolidar el crecimiento de las exportaciones y aprovechar las oportunidades que ofrece la relocalización de cadenas de suministro en América del Norte.

Las autoridades también destacaron

que el dinamismo del comercio exterior ha contribuido a la generación de empleos en industrias orientadas a la exportación, particularmente en los estados del norte y del Bajío, donde se concentra una parte importante de la producción manufacturera del país.

Economistas prevén que, si la demanda internacional se mantiene estable durante el segundo semestre del año, México podría cerrar

2026 con un nuevo récord en el valor total de sus exportaciones. No obstante, advierten que factores externos, como posibles cambios en las políticas comerciales de Estados Unidos o una desaceleración económica global, podrían afectar el ritmo de crecimiento.

Empresarios del sector exportador coincidieron en que el fortalecimiento de la infraestructura logística, la modernización de puertos y aduanas, así como el impulso



a la innovación y la capacitación laboral, serán fundamentales para mantener la competitividad de los productos mexicanos y consolidar la posición del país como uno de los principales exportadores de América Latina.

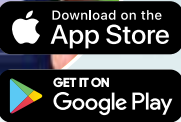
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Sale de la Casa Blanca empleado que ganó más de \$100,000 apostando sobre discursos de Trump



Un operador de teleprompter de la Casa Blanca que fue suspendido sin sueldo tras conocerse que había utilizado información privilegiada para realizar apuestas sobre los discursos del presidente Donald Trump en el mercado de predicciones en línea de Kalshi, ya no ocupa su puesto, según un responsable de la Casa Blanca.

El funcionario, que no estaba autorizado a hacer declaraciones públicas sobre este asunto de personal y habló bajo condición de anonimato, afirmó el martes que el operador del teleprompter, Gabriel Pérez, “ya no trabaja en la administración federal”. El funcionario no quiso precisar si había dimitido o si había sido despedido.

La Casa Blanca confirmó a principios de este mes que Pérez había sido suspendido sin sueldo después de que ABC News informara de que había utilizado información privilegiada para ganar más de \$100,000 apostando por lo que diría el presidente en discursos importantes,

incluido el discurso sobre el estado de la Unión pronunciado a principios de este año.

La portavoz de la Casa Blanca, Karoline Leavitt, había calificado las noticias sobre el uso de información privilegiada como “muy lamentables y, francamente, una vergüenza”.

Robert Denault, abogado de Kalshi y responsable de cumplimiento normativo, declaró en X tras la publicación del reportaje de ABC News que “el equipo de vigilancia de Kalshi detectó, investigó y remitió de inmediato estas operaciones” a la Comisión de Comercio de Futuros de Materias Primas de Estados Unidos, que tiene competencia reguladora en estos asuntos.

En su declaración no mencionó a Pérez.

El reportaje de la ABC describía una actividad sospechosa en el mercado “Mentions” de Kalshi, en el que los usuarios pueden realizar apuestas sobre qué frases y palabras concretas podrían utilizarse en discursos públicos. Kalshi ha comenzado recientemente a exigir a los usuarios que revelen su lugar de trabajo, y la política de la plataforma prohíbe realizar apuestas basadas en información que los usuarios obtengan gracias a su trabajo.

Esta historia fue traducida del inglés al español con una herramienta de inteligencia artificial y fue revisada por un editor antes de su publicación.

El caso ha vuelto a poner sobre la mesa el debate sobre el uso de información privilegiada en los mercados de predicciones, un sector que ha crecido rápidamente en los últimos años. Expertos en ética gubernamental señalan que los empleados públicos con acceso anticipado a información sensible tienen la responsabilidad de evitar cualquier actividad que pueda generar beneficios personales o poner en duda la integridad de las instituciones.

Aunque las autoridades no han informado si Pérez enfrentará consecuencias legales adicionales, el caso podría derivar en investigaciones por parte de los organismos reguladores federales. La Comisión de Comercio de Futuros de Materias Primas (CFTC) tiene la facultad de revisar posibles violaciones relacionadas con el uso indebido de información privilegiada en plataformas de predicción financiera.

La controversia también ha generado llamados para reforzar los controles internos dentro de la Casa Blanca y otras agencias federales, con el fin de prevenir que empleados con acceso a información confidencial la utilicen para obtener ventajas económicas. Analistas consideran que el caso podría impulsar nuevas políticas de transparencia y supervisión sobre la participación de funcionarios públicos en este tipo de mercados.

Milwaukee County Awards \$2M in Grants for ‘Better Ways to Cope’ Projects



MILWAUKEE – Today, the Milwaukee County Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) Behavioral Health Services (BHS) announced the selection of 10 organizations to receive \$2 million in grants as part of the “Better Ways To Cope” initiative. 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Trump’s attacks on mail balloting and concerns over delays

Roughly six weeks before the first midterm ballots are mailed out, the U.S. Postal Service is emerging as a pivotal player in an election season that will determine control of Congress.

President Donald Trump is seeking greater control over mail balloting through an executive order while a change to how the agency processes mail is leading to criticism that it’s failing to deliver ballots on time.

Democratic officials have raised concerns over the past week about how quickly the Postal Service will process ballots after tens of thousands of them in California and hundreds in Wisconsin arrived at local election offices too late to be counted in elections earlier this year. The top election

offices in Kansas and Michigan are urging voters who want to cast their ballots early to avoid the mail and instead drop them off in person.

The Postal Service replied to those concerns by saying it remains “committed to fulfilling our role in the electoral process.”

“We provide a secure, efficient, and effective way for citizens to participate when policymakers decide to use mail as part of their elections,” it said in a statement Tuesday.

Trump’s order puts more focus on mail ballots

The Postal Service faced similar questions about mail delivery in 2024, but the scrutiny this year is heightened because of an executive order Trump issued in

March that seeks to create a national voter list to guide the Postal Service in deciding who gets a mail ballot.

The order has sparked multiple lawsuits and federal court orders, leading to a case now before the U.S. Supreme Court in which the administration is asking the justices to allow it to impose its restrictions on mail balloting.

Trump has lied for years about voter fraud to try to explain away his loss to Democrat Joe Biden in 2020, and mail balloting is a favorite target, even though he has used the method himself. During a recent stop in Michigan, he falsely characterized mail balloting as “inherently corrupt” and added, “Hopefully there will be no mail-in ballots.”

A 2025 report from the research group Brookings identified



about four cases of fraud for every 10 million mail ballots cast.

Despite Trump’s attacks, the method remains popular with voters of both major parties. In 2024, nearly 30% of U.S. voters cast their ballots by mail, according to federal data. In Michigan, where competitive U.S. House and Senate races could help determine the balance of power in Congress, the state said it has sent out more than 2 million absentee ballots for the state’s Aug. 4 primary.

“We want to keep vote by mail. We want to protect it. We want to expand it,” said Jonathan Smith, president of the 200,000-member American Postal Workers Union, which launched a campaign in April promoting it and is opposed to turning the Postal Service into an election administrator. “Why? Because it works.”

Legal battles intensify over Trump’s order

The Postal Service proposed a rule in June in line with Trump’s executive order that would create a national list of eligible voters, based on databases kept by other federal agencies. Only those on the list would be eligible to receive mail ballots.

Democratic officials in nearly two dozen states filed a federal lawsuit in Massachusetts. A federal judge there blocked Trump’s order last month, and an appeals court upheld that ruling, prompting Trump’s appeal to the Supreme Court. But the appeals court for the District of Columbia refused Tuesday to block the order in a separate case, calling a legal challenge premature.

Democratic senators and governors have written to the Postal Service urging it to abandon efforts to implement Trump’s order.

“Donald Trump has shown he’ll stop at nothing to meddle in our upcoming elections,” Wisconsin Sen. Tammy Baldwin said in a statement to The Associated Press. “At best, this new push will exacerbate already severe delays for mail-in voters and at worst, it will stop eligible Americans from casting their ballots.”

In a letter to Democratic senators earlier this month, the heads of the Postal Service said they were abiding by the court rulings that had halted the executive order. But Smith, of the postal workers union, told the AP on Tuesday that USPS information technology staffers who are union members are working on a planned portal for the list of eligible voters “behind the scenes.”

The Postal Service declined to respond to Smith’s statements and said it could not comment about whether it’s moving forward with work related to Trump’s order because of the litigation.

The postal workers’ union opposes the plan for a portal, a national list of eligible voters and using that list to determine who can receive a mail ballot. Smith said it shouldn’t be postal workers’ responsibility “to decide who can vote and who can’t vote.”

The Postal Service has been under financial stress for years and has been consolidating mail processing into fewer regional centers. Mail travels an average of 139 miles (224 kilometers) to reach one and sometimes 500 miles (805 kilometers), according to a recent Brookings report.

In January, a group of mostly Democratic senators said it was concerned about a decision to end twice-daily mail dispatches from local post offices to regional processing centers. The result is that mail arriving after the only daily dispatch would go out the next day.

California officials said the change was a factor in the state rejecting more than 148,000 ballots from its June primary, with 63% of them arriving too late despite a seven-day grace period.

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Lindsey Graham returns home one last time for his funeral in South Carolina

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — The Washington powerbroker Sen. Lindsey Graham returned home to South Carolina for the last time Wednesday for his funeral and burial.

After Graham was eulogized Tuesday in the nation’s capital as an indefatigable dealmaker by the president, vice president and others, mourners in Columbia prepared to remember him Wednesday as the son of pool hall owners who never forgot his roots.

Graham seemed to know every small-town mayor and police chief and the location of every Chick-fil-A across South Carolina. His PAC made sure Republicans had money

to run in legislative and local elections across the state.

Graham died suddenly on July 11 at his home in Washington, likely of an aortic tear, according to preliminary findings. He had just returned from a whirlwind trip to a NATO summit in Turkey, where he celebrated his 71st birthday, and a visit to Ukraine as he negotiated punishing sanctions against Russia. Senators voted late Tuesday to advance the package as a final gesture for their colleague.

Wednesday’s funeral was at First Baptist, the giant downtown church where his predecessor Republican Sen. Strom Thurmond was honored 23 years ago.

Graham’s body was first brought to

the South Carolina Statehouse, where he started his political career in 1993. It paused in front of about a dozen law enforcement officers and four military jets flew over. A horse-drawn caisson then carried his casket to the church, where his family followed military pallbearers carrying it inside. A 130-member choir sang hymns.

Hundreds of movers in South Carolina politics gathered. Both nominees for governor — Republican Attorney General Alan Wilson and Democratic state Rep. Jermaine Johnson — came, along with longtime Republican politicians like former House Speaker and Ambassador to Canada David Wilkins and U.S. Rep. Henry Brown, who served 10 years before leaving in 2011.

Republicans Gov. Henry McMaster, U.S. Sen. Tim Scott and former U.S. Rep. Trey Gowdy were expected to speak. Democratic U.S. Rep. Jim Clyburn, the only remaining member of the South Carolina delegation there when Graham arrived in Washington in 1995, will read Scripture.

Graham’s burial Wednesday near his home in Pickens County was planned as a private ceremony.

On Tuesday, Graham’s flag-draped casket was at the U.S. Capitol, where the Republican spent more than 30 years talking and laughing and badgering his colleagues into action.

President Donald Trump then joined foreign leaders at the Washington National Cathedral, a testament



to Graham’s stature on the global stage.

Trump called Graham “a giant of the United States Senate, a true American original who left us much too soon.”

Graham’s death has created opportunities for change in South Carolina. Graham had already won the Republican nomination as he ran for a fifth term. McMaster named his younger sister Darline to hold his seat until January. Darline Graham then surprised

many by deciding to run for the full six-year term herself.

State law has Republicans holding a special primary in two weeks to decide the new nominee. Eight others are competing, including former Gov. Mark Sanford and U.S. Reps. Ralph Norman and Russell Fry. Three candidates who paid the filing fee were kicked off the ballot because they didn’t meet new party requirements for voting in the Republican primary.

In the United States, cases tend to increase during the spring and summer months, often prompting heightened attention across the food industry.

What Makes Cyclospora So Challenging?

Cyclospora is challenging because the most important control point is often before product reaches a restaurant, retailer or food manufacturing facility. Understanding those conditions like worker health and hygiene, toilet and handwashing access, septic system management, and agricultural water quality are especially important at the farm and packinghouse level.

It is also challenging because parasites are difficult to inactivate. The CDC recommends thorough washing of produce as part of safe food handling, but

washing alone cannot guarantee removal of Cyclospora. The FDA states that chlorine and other common antimicrobial chemical treatments are not considered effective. In practical terms, there is no single product or step that should be positioned as a complete solution.

That does not mean cleaning and sanitation are unimportant. They remain essential to prevent cross-contamination, support sanitary operations, and allow facilities to reset after potentially contaminated products have been handled.

Prevention Starts with the Basics

Today's food system is highly interconnected. Products move through farms, processing facilities, distribution centers, retail locations, and restaurants before reaching consumers. Protecting public health depends on strong systems at every stage and on people, processes and controls working as intended along the way.

For food manufacturers, retailers, restaurants and foodservice operators, six fundamentals continue to make a difference for food safety outcomes:

-Start with supplier controls. Supplier approval, produce safety expectations, agricultural water management, worker hygiene programs, and traceability are critical when the risk may originate upstream.

-Make hygiene non-negotiable. Worker health, handwashing, restroom access, and

exclusion of ill employees are not administrative details. They are core food safety controls, particularly when the hazard is associated with human

fecal contamination.

-Treat sanitation as a daily discipline. Regular cleaning and sanitizing of food-contact surfaces, utensils and equipment help minimize opportunities for cross-contamination.

-Maintain traceability and be ready to act. The ability to identify product sources, lot codes, distribution paths and affected locations quickly can make the difference between a contained event and a broader disruption.

-Train continuously. Food safety procedures are most effective when employees understand them, follow them, and reinforce them every day.

-Verify what you expect. High-performing food safety programs have policies and procedures in place that are measured, monitored, and verified.

These measures matter every day. They become even more important when the industry is responding to an active food safety event.

Leading organizations increasingly focus not only on having food safety procedures in place, but also on verifying that those procedures are consistently executed and effective. Strong food safety cultures are built through accountability, measurement, and continuous improvement.

The Work Consumers Don't See

Consumers often think about food safety when they see a headline. The work itself happens long before that headline appears.

It happens through supplier oversight, inspections, training, sanitation, monitoring, and verification. It happens through the consistent execution of procedures repeated thousands of times every day across the food system.

This is where Ecolab can be a valuable partner. Outbreaks are never just about one product, one facility, or one point in time. They test the strength of the entire food safety system. They also create an opportunity to learn, improve, and reinforce the controls that protect public health.

While food safety challenges remain, the industry has made significant progress through stronger

supplier oversight, sanitation programs, employee training, and operational controls. Those efforts have improved food safety outcomes and helped build confidence in the food system.

The scale of that impact matters. In 2025, Ecolab helped protect 1.7 billion people from foodborne illnesses and infections through our solutions, services, and expertise. By 2030, we aim to protect 2 billion people from foodborne illness and infections, together with our customers.

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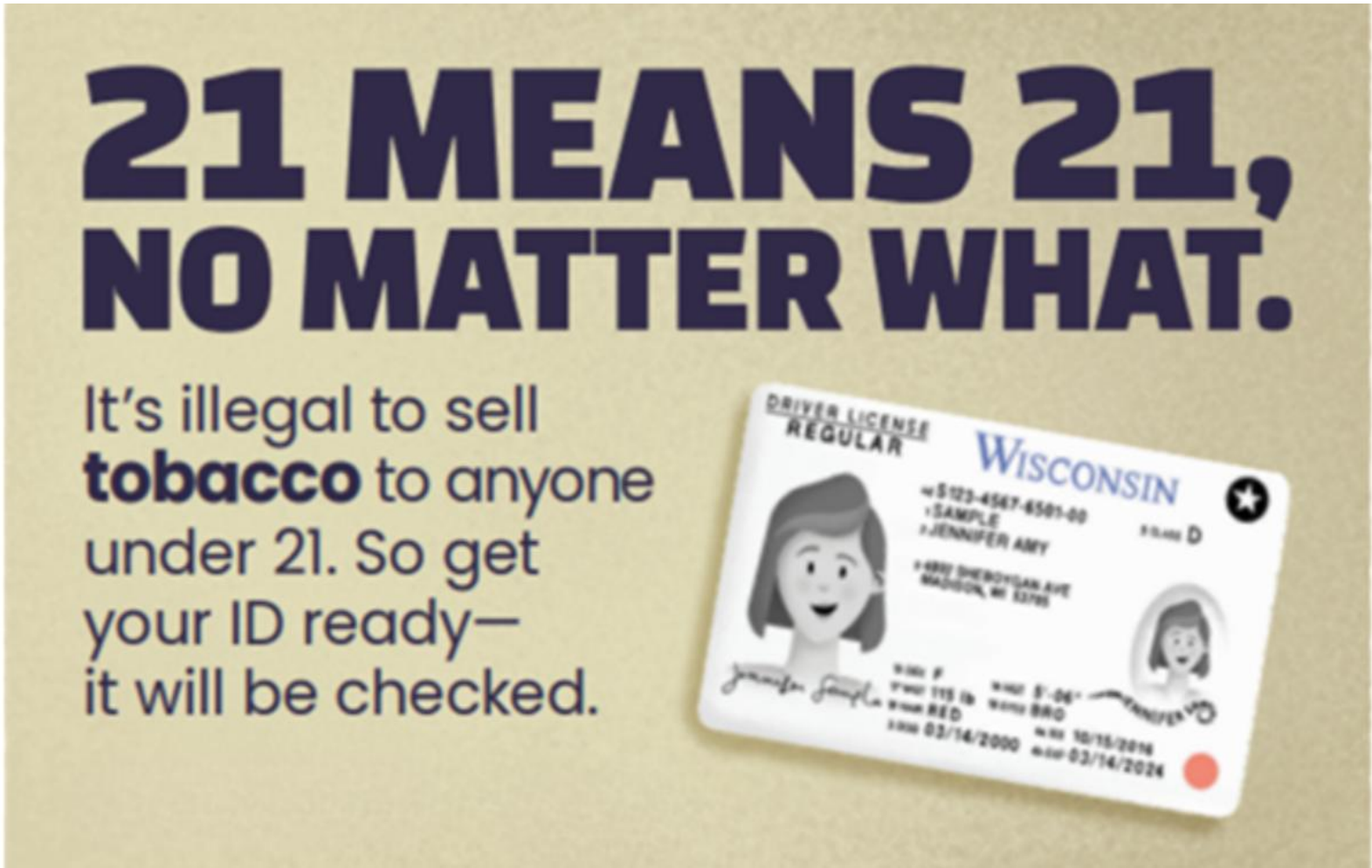
